REMEMBERING BEFORE WE RESOLVE

January is a month filled with forward-looking language. New goals. New habits. New plans. Everywhere we turn, we are encouraged to make resolutions—promises to ourselves about what we will do better this year than last. Scripture, however, often invites us to begin in a different place.

Before God's people are told to move forward, they are usually called to remember.

In Deuteronomy 8, as Israel stands on the edge of the Promised Land, Moses does not begin with instructions for improvement. Instead, he says, "You shall remember the whole way that the Lord your God has led you" (Deut. 8:2). Before new territory comes reflection. Before obedience comes gratitude. Before progress comes memory.

Remembering is not nostalgia. It is a spiritual discipline.

Throughout the Bible, God's people are commanded to remember—not because God forgets, but because we do. We forget His provision in hard seasons. We forget His faithfulness when prayers were slow to be answered. We forget how often grace met us when we had little strength to offer in return.

January is an excellent time for remembering.

Before we resolve to read more, give more, serve more, or do better, we are invited to pause and ask: How has the Lord carried us to this moment? What did He sustain us through this past year? Where did His mercy meet us quietly, faithfully, repeatedly?

The psalmist writes, "I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old" (Psalm 77:11). This kind of remembering steadies the soul. It shifts our focus away from self-reliance and back toward trust.

Christian faith does not begin with our promises to God. It begins with God's promises to us.

When we remember first, our resolutions—if we make them at all—are shaped differently. They become responses to grace rather than attempts to earn it. Obedience flows not from pressure, but from gratitude. Faithfulness grows not from fear of failure, but from confidence in God's unchanging character.

The Lord's Supper itself is built on this rhythm. "Do this in remembrance of me," Jesus says—not so that we can try harder, but so that we never forget what has already been done for us.

As a church family, we enter this new year together not with a list of achievements to chase, but with a story to remember. A story of a faithful God who has walked with His people through every season—joyful and painful alike.

So before you resolve, remember.

Remember the prayers that were answered. Remember the strength given when your own ran out. Remember the grace that carried you through another year.

And then, with hearts grounded in gratitude, we step forward—trusting that the God who has been faithful behind us will be faithful ahead of us as well.

- Moss Creek Pregnancy Center - We delivered new infant clothes and diapers along with some crochet baby hats and blankets made by Donna Horsman.
- Bluffton Soup Kitchen - We provided funds to the kitchen to help them purchase items they needed to feed those who visit their facility.
- Bluffton Senior Center - We provided 26 blankets and 16 toboggans to this center.
- Liza Webber with funds for a summer mission trip.
- Abby Looney with funds on her move to Italy for missions.
- Visits to Canterfield Memory Care Unit now on a monthly schedule thanks the leadership of Kay Kingan, along with Sherry Campbell, Carrie Campbell, Sharon Wastowicz, Debbie Neal, and Brenda Searcy and any others who can join them when they go. Goody bags and lap blankets were given to the memory care residents at their Christmas party on December 16. We have received many wonderful comments on how these visits have blessed the residents of Canterfield and all who visit with our group. If I have missed anyone in this group, I apologize now.
- 227 Prisoner Bags packed and delivered to the association office.
- Our yearly luncheon for all ladies of our church and any friends they wish to invite. We had 19 at our luncheon, with Marilyn Janosko sharing a devotion and Suzanne sharing music with us. We will advertise the date for our 2026 luncheon at least one month before the actual luncheon date.
- Our Blessing Box has been used frequently in the past month. We are now needing our congregation to help us restock our pantry. Please donate cereal, bread, canned meats (Spam, Vienna sausages, tuna, chicken), soup (chicken noodle, vegetable), sugar, instant coffee, coffee creamer, saltine crackers. We of course will take any items you donate, however, these are the most needed items at this time. **Please donate cans with flip tops to open and, we can put bread in the box in the winter and maybe spring. When it gets hotter, the bread will mold if not taken from the box after a few days.

We are very thankful to God and our church through tithes and offerings that fund our budget account that allow us to be able to help those in need when we receive requests for facilities and information for those in need. Every need we are made aware of is prayed over and shared with the entire WOM members who are present at our monthly meetings. We always discuss and agree on all our projects.

We invite all ladies to join our meetings any time. We meet on the second Monday of every month at 1:00 in the conference room in the education building. The meetings are not long, usually one hour to one- and one-half hours.
