# THANKFUL IN EVERY SEASON FINDING GRATITUDE EVEN IN HARDSHIP



November is a time when gratitude is on everyone's lips. We gather around tables, share meals with loved ones, and reflect on the blessings of the past year. But for many people,

this season also comes with a quiet ache—a loved one is missing, an illness lingers, a job has been lost, or life simply isn't turning out the way we expected. It can be hard to feel thankful when the heart is heavy.

The Bible reminds us, however, that thanksgiving isn't just for the easy seasons. "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Those words from the Apostle Paul weren't written from a comfortable home or a holiday feast—they came from a man who often wrote from prison cells, faced persecution, and carried deep burdens for the churches he loved. His gratitude wasn't based on how well things were going. It was rooted in the unchanging goodness of God.

Thanksgiving in hardship is not about pretending pain doesn't exist. It's about remembering that God is still at work in the midst of it. When we give thanks in difficult seasons, we declare our trust in God's character, not just His blessings. Paul wrote to the Philippians, "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you... for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now" (Philippians 1:3–5). He was in chains, but his heart was free—free to rejoice, free to trust, free to give thanks.

Many of us have learned that some of the deepest gratitude is born in the darkest times. It's when the noise is stripped away that we begin to see more clearly the daily mercies of God: the friend who calls, the small provision that arrives at just the right moment, the quiet strength He gives to take one more step. Gratitude in these moments is not shallow—it's a powerful act of faith.

This November, whether your heart is overflowing with joy or weighed down by burden, I encourage you to pause and give thanks—not for every situation, but in every situation. Give thanks that God is near to the brokenhearted. Give thanks that He is faithful even when we are weak. Give thanks that His love is unchanging and His promises remain sure.

Let this be a season where we don't just count our blessings when life is easy, but where we choose gratitude as an anchor in the storm. A thankful heart doesn't erase the hard places, but it does remind us that we are never alone in them. God walks with us. And for that, we can always give thanks.

The Bible encourages believers to give thanks for spiritual blessings and faithfulness, to remember God's goodness and faithfulness, and to live a life of thankfulness.

This year, as we gather to celebrate Thanksgiving, let's remember to celebrate the greatest gift of all—salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ.

Here are Bible verses to help you reflect on the abundant blessings of God.

1 THESSALONIANS 5:16-18: Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

**PSALM 103:1-4:** Praise the LORD, my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. Praise the LORD, my soul, and forget not all His benefits — who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion.

COLOSSIANS 2:6-7 (NKJV): As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving.

**ISAIAH 12:4-5 (NASB)**: And on that day you will say, "Give thanks to the LORD, call on His name. Make known His deeds among the peoples; make them remember that His name is exalted." Praise the LORD in song, for He has done glorious things; let this be known throughout the earth.

**JAMES 1:17:** Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows.

1 CHRONICLES 16:34 (ESV): Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever!

2 CORINTHIANS 9:15: Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!
