Are we a church that embodies the **Great Commandment?**

The Great Commandment is found in Matthew 22: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Do we (you and I) love God? I mean do we really love God?

The adverb 'really' means do we love God with all of heart, soul, and mind. In other words, do we have an undying, persevering, and passionate love for God? Do we? Do you?

How do we measure or evaluate that kind of love that Jesus says is the most important part of our being. What evidence should we look for as a reality check on the depth of our love for God. Jesus answers that when He says we are to follow up our love for God by loving one another. Simply put, loving one another means - if we are to have an intimate relationship with the God of love, comfort, encouragement, and hope, then we need to pass along his love, comfort, encouragement, and hope to others. After all, we are to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.

So, what does love, comfort, encouragement and hope look like in our relationships and how we relate to one another. I believe we must be intentional about identifying and meeting the real needs of people, help people experience God's Word at the point of their need, and communicate the true character of God.

What motivates the believer of Jesus Christ is the compassion of Jesus Christ - demonstrating love in action, and to provide caring concern for others. Love in action means we are intentional about meeting each other's relational needs as illuminated in God's Word: acceptance, affection, appreciation, approval, attention, comfort, encouragement, respect, security, and support.

As the Body of Christ, the church, with the power of the Holy Spirit, we can live out the Great Commandment by opening up our hearts to the needs of one another. In a dark and hurting world, we have the opportunity to relationally care for people with the love of Christ bringing light and hope from God who desires that all be reconciled back to Him.

QUARTERLY BUSINESS MEETING REVIEW

At our January 31st Quarterly Business Meeting, we approved Okatee Baptist Church Year End financial report. Our budget total for 2023 was \$374,321 and we received \$417,198.52. We ended up with a surplus of \$42,877 to end 2023. What a great year and what a committed membership in financial support of the work God is doing at Okatee Baptist Church.

Having been blessed financially, the Finance Team presented 2 motions to the congregation to enhance our missional support. The first motion was to take \$7,500.00 out of our General Fund and add it to the \$12,500.00 already given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. That means Okatee Baptist Church can provide \$20,000.00 to missionaries across the world as they share the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The second Motion was to provide an extra gift of \$5,426.00 to the Cooperative Program to comply with our tradition of giving 10% of our receipts. Please refer to the newsletter insert to how our Cooperative Program total of \$41,744.00 is distributed.

Our total Great Commission giving which includes the Cooperative Program, Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, Annie Armstrong Easter Offering, Janie Chapman State Mission Offering, Savannah River Baptist Convention, Savannah River Baptist Association Hanshew Offering, and Direct Mission Offerings equals \$86,544.00. Oh, how God loves a cheerful giver!!
