TO GOD BE THE GLORY

³ Oh, what a wonderful God we have! How great are his wisdom and knowledge and riches! How impossible it is for us to understand his decisions and his methods! ³⁴ For who among us can know the mind of the Lord? Romans 11:33-34a (NLT).

There is no doubt, God is wonderful! Actually, he is beyond wonderful! In fact, He is beyond any word we can use to describe Him. And as I look back over my life, I am living proof that it is impossible to fully understand His decisions and methods. What I mean is that my story, my path, my journey is beyond my imagination. Beyond my imagination because of where I started, what I have gone through, and where I am now. With that said, I am reminded what James wrote; "² Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, ³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ⁴ Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. ⁶ But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind." (James 1:2-6 NIV)

My life has been full of trials which has been a testing of my faith, and many times I have asked God for wisdom and He has always provided the answers that I needed - even though I didn't always understand and agree. The Holy Spirit through James 1:5-6 convicts me because there have been times that I have doubted the answers God provided. The priests did as they were instructed, and sure enough, when they stepped into the river the waters ceased flowing. Stepping out in faith is the Christian life, because it is one of the significant ways God's Glory is revealed.

So, as we move ahead as a church and individually, to God be the Glory!!

BUILDING AND GROUNDS TEAM

The Building and Grounds Team is excited to announce that we have recommended, and the Deacons approved, Delta Roofing Company as our general contractor for the repair of the sanctuary. Delta Roofing has years of experience in both residential and commercial roof repair and are qualified to complete this project. They will use and oversee subcontractors to handle all non roof repairs and renovations.

Delta Roofing Company met with Pastor Woody, Jim Phillips, and our church Trustees, Bill Copeland, David Mercer, and Parker Sutler on Tuesday, April 29 to sign the contract. The next step will be for sub contractors to come in and assess the work they will be responsible for and provide bids to Delta Roofing. That should take about 2 weeks. From there, Delta Roofing will work with our insurance company, Brotherhood Mutual, to finalize the specific costs for the project. That process will take about 2 weeks. Then the work can begin which is estimated to take around 6 months.

Our insurance company has agreed to pay for all but \$7,500 of the project. One of our generous members has covered the \$7,500 deductible. Delta Roofing has agreed to put our building back the way it was if not better and bring it up to current codes. Please make it a priority in your prayer time for the project as well as the safety of all the workers involved.

GO THE DISTANCE: VBS SPORTS CAMP 2025 THEME

Go The Distance examines the concept of perseverance and how we as believers can continue to persevere in our journey with God. It uses the missionary journeys of Paul (I have finished the race...) as the scriptural back drop.

At VBS sports camp, UW breaks down the concept with 5 steps to help us persevere. On Day 1 of camp, we teach that "in order to Go the Distance you must be willing to change". Maybe God wants you to change your environment, or change your goals, or change your activities. Every lesson has a modern day sports story that illustrates the first Key Point of the lesson. This year, it is a story about the LA Dodgers and winning the World Series in 2024. The first key point in the lesson is that *change can happen in an instant*. The Bible story is the conversion of Saul on the road to Damascus and the second Key Point (always a "God point") is that *God can change us on the inside*.

We hope that you will make it a point to invite children ages 4-12 to our June 9-13 sports camp at OBC and that you also will consider volunteering and having an influence on the lives of the children who attend!
